#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- ➤ The institution is contributing to the quality development in the curriculum through its senor teachers who are members of BOS of Autonomous Colleges.
- ➤ They are sensitized through IQAC about the curriculum goals and strengthening the conceptual teaching.

Faculty members are encouraged to attend orientation programmes and Refresher Courses to improve the quality of teaching and learning.

Teachers are encouraged to assess the students continuously. This is done in two ways. i.e. Formative assessment and Summative assessment.

- Basing on this, suggestions are made to improve results.

- ➤ The college encourages staff and students to engage in research activities.
- Faculty are guided to approach UGC and other funding agencies for financial assistance to pursue research.
- > Students are also advised to take study projects in order to inculacate research culture.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Various employment news and notifications are displayed for students on the notice board.
- Various magazines, news papers, journals and reference books available for staff and students.
- > Several text books, reference books were added and Journals were subscribed with the grants from UGC.
- > The institute has three LCD projectors to enable the students ICT based learning.
- Seventy two computers with internet and reprography facility available for students and staff for strengthening research activities.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- ➤ The available human resources were well exploited for quality education through proper planning and inspection. The students circles are formed and they are involved in all the development activities of the institution.
- > Computer education was made mandatory to all the staff members for self-management of the ICT.
- ➤ The curriculum was effectively dispensed by practical training. This was achieved through MOUs with the local industries.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Permanent Lecturers are recruited by Public Service Commission who is highly qualified with NET/M.Phil./Ph.D. qualifications.
- The guest and contract lecturers who performed well are given teaching assignments in the next academic year automatically.

- Industry interaction is achieved through industrial visits where students can see the latest technological advancements.
- > Collaboration with the industries is formed with MOU's and linkages.

- ➤ Merit list is prepared as per the reservation rules and displayed in the college notice board.
